

Minneapolis Convention Center Statement

The City of Minneapolis is committed to providing safety and security for all people in Minneapolis and has robust guidelines for interacting with ICE. As a public building, the Minneapolis Convention Center (MCC) cannot interfere with federal law enforcement, but will observe and report any ICE presence, including requesting warrant and officer details. As a policy, ICE should not access rental or nonpublic spaces without MCC or client consent.

Safety & Awareness Update

Federal Immigration Enforcement in Minneapolis

At this time, there is no credible information indicating any foreseeable or unforeseen incidents on our campus that would disrupt event operations or create an unsafe environment.

MCC will continue to closely monitor potential risks and community impacts and maintain regular communication with local and state law enforcement agencies.

If building operations or security measures need to change to ensure a safe event experience, updates will be shared directly with events.
